4. Matters Arising

Item 4.1 Court Inn Clamber status

Mike Elliot asked for an update on the Court Inn Clamber. He was referred to previous email correspondence following the event.

5. General Business

Item 5.1 Officials' reports - summary

5.1.1 Cross Country Captains

Geoff Davis provided an update on the success of the previous cross country season which saw 86 runners from the club competing. Katy Walton and Rob Everson were highlighted as strong performers at the fast end of the field. Innes Hodgson and Anita Dunseith were mentioned for significant improvement and dedication to cross country.

5.1.2 Club Captains

Paul Evans and Anna Seeley reported on a successful year for the club which now has over 250 members. They noted that the Grand Prix fixtures had been changed significantly for the next season but pointed out this was a fluid process and anyone with suggestions should contact them and John Hutchinson.

5.1.3 Treasurer

Michael presented an update of the club finances (attached). It was noted (see item 5.4 below) that with the propsed reduction in membership fees, club surplus would be significantly reduced next year.

Transport Report – Andy James

At present the buses run on a annual 'no subsidy' basis but that does mean that the lesser attended races have to be subsidised by the better attended ones if the fares are not to deter people from using the bus. That does not give me a problem but one person has queried why the GNR bus was so expensive at £11. The answer was that £1 goes towards a 'free' pub buffet and the profit of about £5pp balances losses on some of the other trips. If the meeting were to decide that the GNR bus should be charged at cost (given the high entry fee and that the volunteers use it), then an annual subsidy of hopefully no more than £400 would be needed at current bus usage and prices.

I attach the bus finances schedule for 2014 for information (GNR and Brampton not finalised yet and there may be a bus for the Morpeth XC).
